õOur theme for this yearøs memorial day is an asbestos banö.

õA <u>recent report</u> urged the government to consider banning the importation and use of asbestos in New Zealand. Almost every week RMTU members find new containments of asbestos in their workplacesö says Wayne Butson.

õThis has to stop, but it cannot while the government continues to allow the importation of products containing asbestosö.

õWorkers should not have to work in buildings and vehicles that contain asbestos. Itøs 2015 ó much of the developed world has removed this risk by banning asbestosö says Wayne Butson.

õRMTU members feel very strongly about this issue and Workersø Memorial Day because our union has suffered a terrible losses of life within the rail and port industries.ö

Actions across the country: the RMTU will hold large ceremonies at noon at the Dunedin, Napier, Christchurch and Lower Hutt rail workshops. <u>All trains will be stopping for one minute at midday with suitable public announcements being made on passenger trains to explain the train stoppings.</u>
